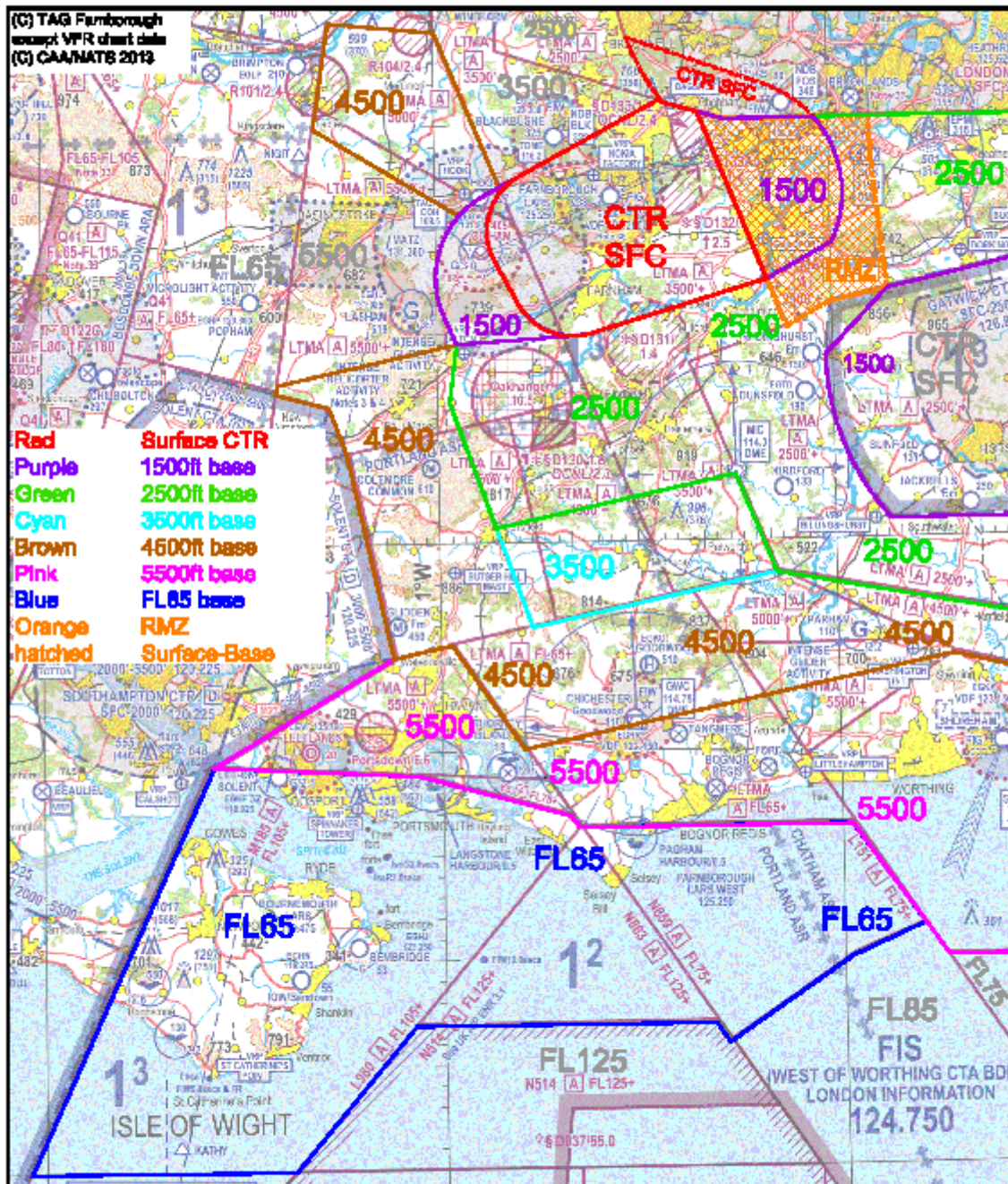

The operator of Farnborough Airport, TAG Farnborough, is applying for controlled airspace.

Their proposals directly affect current controlled and uncontrolled airspace across a large area of southern England – not only in the immediate vicinity to Farnborough Airport – just take a look at the map above.

The base of many areas of existing airspace would be lowered, and large areas of new airspace would be introduced. Their plans represent the most substantial redesign and increase of airspace in the UK for many years.

If TAG get what they want, the impact on general aviation will be significant – it will range from catastrophic for some groups, through to extremely disruptive for others.

The impacts are not restricted to aviators and aviation. Many other local groups are also likely to be adversely affected.
